

CITY OF KNOB NOSTER
Board of Aldermen Session
Meeting Minutes—January 6, 2026

1. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance. Invocation.
2. MAYOR BYERLY called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. All present included: ALDERMEN THERING, CHARRETTE, PALMER, KLEOPPEL and SMITH. A quorum was verified.
3. ALDERMAN PALMER made motion to approve the Agenda with a second by ALDERMAN THERING. Motion carried 5 ayes to 0 nays.
4. ALDERMAN SMITH to approve the consent agenda consisting of a motion:
 - a. Approving minutes of the December 16, 2025, Board of Aldermen meeting with a correction to Item 14.

ALDERMAN KLEOPPEL seconded the motion. Motion carried 5 ayes to 0 nays.

5. The Board of Aldermen reviewed the bill list.
6. ALDERMAN CHARRETTE inquired about the officer's mutual assistance to the Highway Patrol at an incident outside city limits. He also asked if all police officers were up to date on their trainings. ALDERMAN STAUFFER-BAUM said that a neighbor of his was having issues with their sidewalk. The Public Works Director said that he had spoken to the neighbor and he had a plan to resolve the issue. ALDERMAN STAUFFER-BAUM inquired about the City's ordinance regarding damaged homes. ALDERMAN PALMER wished all a Happy New Year. MAYOR BYERLY thanked Alderman Palmer for her decoration of Norman's Corner for the Christmas parade. He said that candidates had filed for Ward I and Ward III. There was no candidate for Ward II. He explained the write-in process for the April election. He will be attending the change of command ceremony on WAFB on Friday. Johnson County United Way will be having a chili cook-off contest and the Mayor is looking for volunteers. He invited all to the Park Board meeting on Tuesday, January 14, 2026, at 6:30pm at City Hall. He mentioned the Christmas day water leak and the fact that it was caused by a gas leak repair. He thanked Public Works for their speedy repair on a holiday.
7. There was no virtual or in-person public participation.
8. The City Administrator relayed his report.
9. Discussion was held regarding the contract submitted by Maguire Iron, Inc. for water tower rehabilitation. The City Administrator relayed that the City's engineers believe that Maguire Iron will be the right company. Motion was made to approve the Mayor or City Administrator to sign the contract submitted by Maguire Iron, Inc. for \$410,000.00 by ALDERMAN CHARRETTE with a second by ALDERMAN STAUFFER-BAUM. Motion carried 6 ayes to 0 nays.
10. Motion to pass Bill No. 010626-A: Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission Transportation Alternatives Program Supplemental Agreement, to its first reading, by title only, was made by ALDERMAN CHARRETTE, with a second by ALDERMAN PALMER.

Motion carried 6 ayes to 0 nays.

Discussion was held.

MAYOR Byerly had the City Clerk present the Bill by title only.

Motion to pass Bill No. 010626-A: Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission Transportation Alternatives Program Supplemental Agreement, to its second reading, by title only, was made by ALDERMAN THERING, with a second by ALDERMAN SMITH.

11. Discussion was held regarding approval of KNPD to get the PA Portal required to file electronic tickets from Omnigo. The cost to add on the portal is \$2,340.00 for 2026. ALDERMAN CHARRETTE inquired what had already been paid to Omnigo for the current software. The City Clerk said that \$9,479.49 had been paid in May 2025 for the software. In order for the tickets that KNPD writes to be accepted by the Johnson County Circuit Clerk, it must be done through Omnigo. Motion was made to approve the addition of the PA Portal to the Omnigo contract for \$2,340.00 per year by ALDERMAN CHARRETTE with a second by ALDERMAN SMITH. Motion carried 6 ayes to 0 nays.
12. Motion was made to adjourn at 6:46 pm by ALDERMAN CHARRETTE and was seconded by ALDERMAN KLEOPPEL. Motion carried 6 ayes to 0 nays.
