CITY OF KNOB NOSTER Board of Aldermen Meeting Minutes June 5, 2018

- ACTING PRESIDENT BABINEAUX called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. ALDERMAN BABINEAUX, COHEN, CHARRETTE, THERING, LIECHTI and DUDTE were present. A quorum was verified.
- 2. The May 15, 2018, meeting minutes were reviewed by the Board of Aldermen.
- 3. The Board of Aldermen reviewed the bill list.
- 4. ALDERMAN CHARRETTE stated that one of the City limits signs is down. He also said that the speed limit sign on Division Road and the Division/Washington Street sign is down. ALDERMAN THERING stated that the assessed valuation of the City of Knob Noster would allow the City to be able to borrow funds for street repair but that it would take a bond levy tax increase voted by the public to be done.
